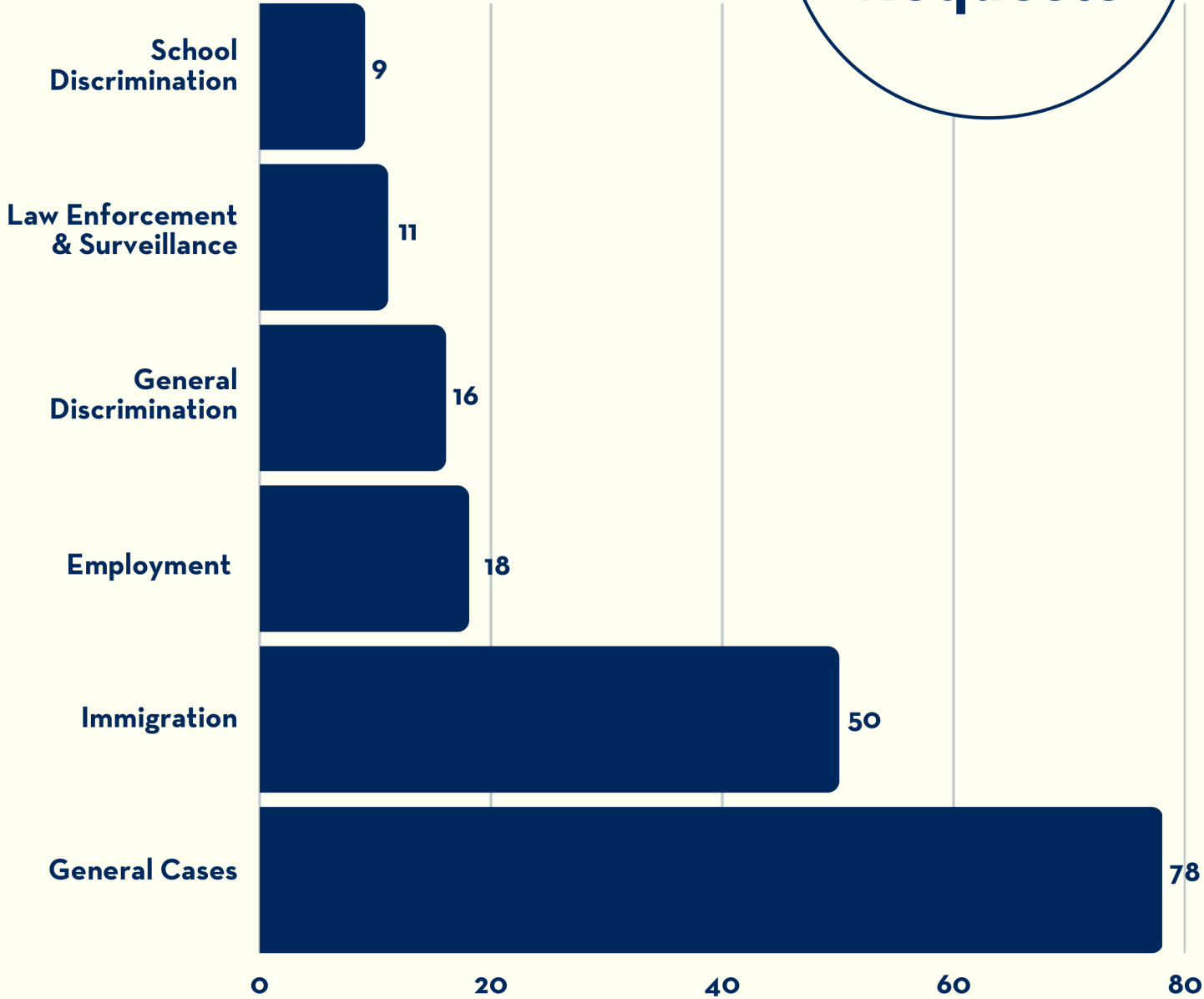


Civil Rights Highlights

Our legal team provides free legal services to Ohio Muslims and work to protect and defend the constitutional rights of American Muslims, thereby supporting the rights of all Americans.

As the Ohio Muslim community grows, so does our community’s need for legal help. While our attorneys specialize in combating Islamophobia and religious discrimination, we also help Ohio Muslims find the resources they need for a variety of legal issues.

Our legal team settled six cases, including employment discrimination and victim advocacy cases which resulted in clients receiving compensation.

Legal Services

Our legal team is committed to ensuring equal protection of the law for Muslims and other marginalized communities in Ohio. We represent Muslims facing religious discrimination and provide consultation to community members navigating a variety of legal issues.

Legal Grants

We received grants from the Ohio State Bar Foundation and Columbus City Council.



Second Chances Clinic Grant

Thanks to a generous grant from the Ohio State Bar Foundation, our CAIR-Ohio team was able to serve community members touched by the justice system in need of record sealing assistance through free Second Chances Legal Clinics.

We believe everyone deserves a second chance, regardless of their background and lived experiences. We are proud of our ability to provide expungement services to all seeking a way forward throughout their reentry journey.

Columbus Families Together Fund Grant

CAIR-Ohio is a proud recipient of the Columbus Families Together Fund (CFTF) grant which was established in 2017 by Columbus City Council to protect immigrant and refugee families from the financial and emotional devastation that results from aggressive immigration enforcement. The grant allows CAIR-Ohio to support eligible immigrants and families through free legal education and direct representation. Through Know-Your-Rights workshops, free legal clinics, and year-round client intake calls, our team assists our most vulnerable community members.

We remain committed to our guiding principles of providing quality legal services to Ohio Muslim families.

Know-Your-Rights Workshops

Throughout 2022, our team prepared and disseminated educational materials as well as conducted Know-Your-Rights workshops at various community events and centers to empower Ohio Muslims. These educational sessions helped equip community members with the tools necessary to self-advocate when dealing with harassment and a wide range of challenges including seeking religious accommodation at work and school.

Legal Internship

CAIR-Ohio's legal internship offers incoming and current law students the opportunity to work alongside the legal team to serve members of Ohio's Muslim community. They engage in various elements of legal work including client intakes, legal research, and community presentations. Additionally, working alongside office staff, legal interns develop educational materials and events pertaining to relevant legal issues for the community.

Legal interns gain hands-on experience working in a legal setting, shadowing attorneys, and learn about the unique legal challenges faced by Ohio's Muslim community, while developing a range of practical skills useful in a legal career.

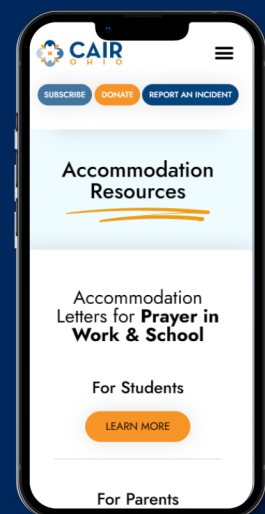

At CAIR-Ohio, we believe that young people have the power to make a difference in their communities. That is why we are committed to creating spaces for youth in all aspects of our work. We provide a variety of programs, student organization support, leadership trainings, and volunteer opportunities designed to empower young people to become engaged members of their community.

Our programs are tailored to the needs and interests of Muslim students, and we work closely with participants to foster experiences that help them grow and develop as leaders. Through our youth empowerment work, we aim to create a community of leaders committed to promoting social justice and making a positive impact on the world around them.

EPIC

Empowerment Program for Incarcerated Communities

The EPIC program, established in 2016, offers religious materials and civil rights & advocacy services to inmates in Ohio upon request. EPIC has experienced a significant increase in demand for religious materials, aid in securing religious rights, and referrals to attorneys.

Religious materials provided include the English translation of the Quran, kufis, hijabs, prayer rugs, and Islamic information. Civil rights advocacy services offered by EPIC include assistance with halal meals, Ramadan accommodations, and access to religious services.

Additionally, EPIC aims to help formerly incarcerated individuals reintegrate into society by providing information on reentry programs and services that can help them achieve their full potential and live a life of dignity and joy.

The awardees have displayed resolve in the face of adversity and transformed their experience for the betterment of those around them. They exemplify what it means to be an American Muslim.



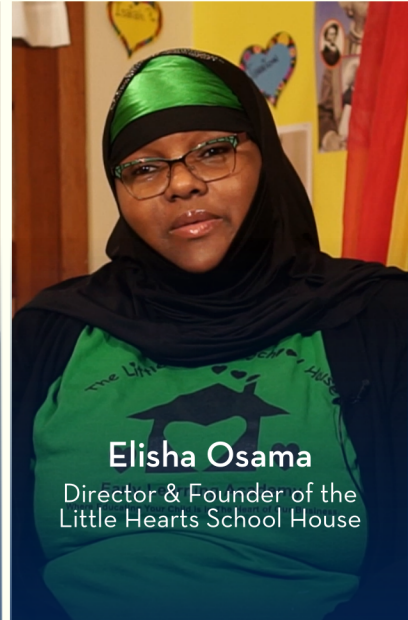

We engage in non-partisan lobbying efforts to influence policy change, voter education and mobilization to increase political participation, community organizing to build grassroots support, and legal advocacy to protect the rights of and empower Ohio Muslims.

Get-Out-The-Vote & Election Work

In 2022, CAIR-Ohio remained committed to maximizing and facilitating Muslim civic engagement in our democracy. We continued to advocate for systemic change by empowering Muslims and other marginalized groups with the tools to productively engage with our political system at the ballot box and beyond.

Through non-partisan voter education and mobilization efforts, we work to preserve and expand voting rights, building an equal path for all Americans. Our civic engagement projects this year included various initiatives such as voter registration drives, voter guides, GOTV drives, and educational workshops. These projects were designed to encourage Muslims and other marginalized communities to participate in the democratic process and exercise their right to vote.

In recognition of our efforts, we received a grant from Cleveland Votes as part of their Equitable Civic Engagement program. This grant helped us to expand our outreach efforts and strengthen our commitment to empower underrepresented communities.

The Fight for Fair District Maps

CAIR-Ohio continues to advocate for accurate and equitable representation through fair maps, ensuring that the Muslim community's voice is heard and not weakened by gerrymandering. We continue to work with various coalitions and organizations, including the Equal Districts Coalition, to push for transparency and fairness in redistricting. CAIR-Ohio's efforts aim to safeguard and amplify Muslim voices in Ohio, promoting a more representative and inclusive democracy.

Legislative Advocacy

Muslim Hill Days on the Capitol

CAIR-Ohio staff and interns traveled to Washington, D.C. to meet with 15 congressional offices from across the state. We discussed legislation affecting the Muslim community, such as immigration, student debt relief, and combatting Islamophobia. Our objectives were to improve transparency of the Department of Homeland Security's CP3 Program, gain support for the Afghan Adjustment Act, cancel all student debt, establish interest-free federal student loans, and advance the International Combating Islamophobia Act.

Muslim Statehouse Advocacy Day

Over 60 Ohio Muslims participated in our 4th Annual Muslim Advocacy Day, attending 30 meetings with legislative offices to advocate for religious accommodations, healthcare access, and culturally responsive education. The event included advocacy training, followed by a keynote from local leader and activist Imam Horsed Noah on the religious obligation of civic engagement. Attendees split into groups to meet with legislative offices to support or oppose specific bills, including HB 353 (Support), HB 322/327/616 (Oppose), and SB 123/HB 598 (Oppose).
